Her daughter and son always had a strong bond, and in that moment she captured the essence of that bond on film when they spontaneously grasped each others' hands and started walking down the beach

It's a fun piece that just makes me smile. At my larger studio at home I'm completing a 40" x 30" oceanscape and am about to embark on my seventh Strength of Woman Series painting. A very special relative modeled for me on Easter Sunday.

We are now representing one of Delaware's, and the nation's, finest sculptors, Kristen Visbal, and more new works by other artists are starting to trickle in.

We'll formally introduce Kristen, who has a lifelong relationship with Bethany Beach, with a reception when several new bronzes are complete, at this moment estimated to be in June.

You'll find her to be truly interesting, amazingly talented and whole-heartedly dedicated to her art. She and I have been

John will perform original compositions about the beach area he's loved all his life, songs from his six albums and take special requests. Be sure to head upstairs or park yourself on a butterfly or dragonfly bench outside the gallery to enjoy his performance starting at 11. As long as the weather is good, we'll have the door open and you can sit inside or out and still enjoy his performance.

John's albums featuring songs inspired by the Delaware coast, including "My Bethany," are available now in the gallery.
